Certificate in Entrepreneurship Law

Brooklyn Law School offers a Certificate for students interested in exploring legal issues surrounding entrepreneurship and preparing to represent new ventures for start-ups and growing commercial and not-for-profit companies. To earn the Certificate, students must satisfactorily complete at least **seven** total courses from the various course listings below, broken down as follows:

- (1) Four "foundation" courses;
- (2) Two "skills / practice-based" courses; and
- (3) One "Advanced General / Business Formation and Growth" course.

To help students with their own thinking about how to develop a course of study and prepare for practice in a particular area, the Skills/Practice-Based and Advanced courses are organized below in terms of particular industries, sectors, or legal subjects. It is not necessary, however, for both of a student's skills/practice- based courses to fall within a specific grouping for the student to earn the Certificate and the subject area Advanced Courses, while not required for the Certificate, are included as suggestions for gaining expertise for practice in certain designated areas. This curriculum is designed recognizing that the needs of businesses (and particularly new ventures and businesses) vary, and many different combinations of courses might prove useful depending on a student's plans or preferences.
