2022 Roundtable in International Business Law at Brooklyn Law School

On September 16-17, 2022, the Dennis J. Block Center for the Study of International Business Law (Block Center) will sponsor a Scholars' Roundtable at Brooklyn Law School. Scholars writing in a diverse range of fields related to international business, economic, and financial law are invited to submit proposals to present works in progress for an intense day of discussion with other scholars in the field. Participants will be expected to read all papers in advance of the Roundtable and offer commentary on each of the presentations. This year, we are planning on holding the event in person. If held in person, scholars selected for the Roundtable who come from outside the New York City area will receive a \$500 stipend from Brooklyn Law School.

Requirements for Submission

- Applicants must hold a fulltime position (including visitor/fellowship) at a law school or university. Scholars from outside the U.S. are encouraged to apply.
- Scholars who anticipate holding a fulltime faculty appointment in 2023-2024 are welcome.
- Applicants should submit a 2-5 page proposal, abstract, or summary of the paper. All papers presented must be unpublished at the time of the Roundtable. Papers that have been accepted for publication but are not yet in print are welcome.
- Papers relating to any area of international business law are welcome. This is construed broadly to include all aspects of international economic law (trade, investment, tax, and finance), transnational business regulation, cross-border transactions, law relating to multinational business enterprises and securities, and international business disputes.

<u>Applicants should submit a proposal by June 17, 2022 here</u>. Scholars selected to present at the Roundtable will be notified by July 8, 2022.
