<b>FIRST SCHOLARSHIP PRIZE</b>	Brooklyn Law School offers a prize to the member of the graduating class who has attained the highest average in examinations and general excellence of scholarship. <b>John David Moore</b>
<b>SECOND SCHOLARSHIP PRIZE</b>	Brooklyn Law School offers a prize to the member of the graduating class who has attained the second highest average in examinations and general excellence of scholarship. <b>Stephen A. Savoca</b>
<b>FACULTY PRIZE</b>	The faculty awards a special prize, from time to time, to recognize a student whose exceptional academic record while in law school evidences great potential for future scholarly and professional achievement. <b>John David Moore</b>
<b>DONALD W. MATHESON MEMORIAL PRIZE</b>	The late George W. Matheson, Class of 1917, established an annual prize in memory of his brother, Donald W. Matheson, Class of 1914. <b>STANLEY W. NATHANSON PRIZE</b>	Offered in memory of Stanley W. <b>WILLIAM PAYSON RICHARDSON MEMORIAL PRIZE</b>	This award is given, under the terms of the will of the late Mrs. William Payson Richardson, to an outstanding student chosen by the faculty of the Law School. <b>Leanne Monique Welds</b>
<b>REGINA CREA MEMORIAL PRIZE</b>	A prize has been established by the Law School faculty and administration, in memory of the beloved wife of Professor Joseph Crea, to be awarded to the member of the graduating class who, in the judgment of the faculty, has rendered the most devoted and disinterested service to the Law School during his or her school career. <b>Joseph Karume James</b>

<b>PROFESSOR SAMUEL HOFFMAN MEMORIAL PRIZE</b>	This prize, established in memory of Professor Samuel Hoffman, Class of 1948, by his family, friends and colleagues, is awarded to the students who have achieved excellence in the study of corporate law. Professor Hoffman was a distinguished scholar and dedicated teacher who educated generations of Brooklyn Law School students. He took a personal interest in their progress and proudly followed their professional achievements over the years. Evelyn Reid lived in peace and faced death with a grace and courage that inspired all who knew her.
